2010 State Indoor Championship

Saturday, MARCH 27th and Sunday, MARCH 28th, 2010

Cumberland Bowhunters

1. Practice: Practice will be available on Friday, March 26th after 6:00pm, for a fee, and after the completion of competition on Saturday, March 27th only.

2. The competition: You will shoot two NFAA Indoor 300 rounds. You can shoot either on Saturday or Sunday, one round on each day or both on one day. Each day's official round will consist of 12 ends of five arrows from 20 yards for Youth to Senior and at 10 yards for Cubs. State and or flight winners will be determined by the highest total score and X count for both rounds. Inside out X's will be counted for the last three rounds as a tie breaker. The First two ends will be practice at the beginning of each round - no other practice will be allowed on the tournament range, until after the days competition is complete. The target will be the NFAA 40 cm. single spot scored 5, 4, 3, 2, 1, or the 16-cm. five spot scored 5 and 4. There will be a time limit of 4 minutes per end of five arrows.

3. Scoring: All arrows will be individually scored as X, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1 or 0. Inside out X's on the last three ends of each round. Arrows touching the line between two scoring rings will be scored the higher value. If an archer shoots more than prescribed number of arrows in an end, the excess arrow(s) of higher value will not be counted, and a penalty of one point per excess arrow will be assessed. All scorecards are to be kept in duplicate and must be completely and correctly filled out and signed by the shooter and scorer for one or both rounds. Failure to sign your scorecards is cause for disqualification. Completed scorecards must be submitted to tournament officials by the shooter.

4. Tie Breaking: Ties after considering score and regular X count at the end of the completion of all rounds will be decided by the inside out X's recorded on the last three ends of each round for a final tiebreaker.

5. Targets: Each archer will have a new target face at the start of each official scoring round. If shooting three lines, at the conclusion of four scoring ends, targets will be rotated - bottom to middle, middle to top and top to bottom. At the end of eight scoring ends, the targets will be rotated again. If shooting two lines, at the conclusion of six scoring ends, targets will be rotated - top to bottom and bottom to top. Replacement of target faces will be done at the discretion of the Target Captain or Line Judge.

6. Equipment Rules: The tournament will be conducted in accordance with NFAA equipment rules. **Please check the NFAA By-Laws available at your club or on line at National Field Archery Association.** Bowhunter Freestyle and Bowhunter Freestyle Limited shooters are reminded not to adjust their equipment after shooting the first arrow for score.

7. Equipment Repair: At the discretion of the Line Judge, a 15 minute time period will be allowed for major equipment repair and may include one 5 arrow practice end.

8. Styles and Flights: MAA members shall compete by MAA styles and flights for awards. Flights will be set by the NFAA Flight chart for under 200 shooters and will be determined at the end of the competition. Guest shooters compete for awards as determined by the host club.

9. Awards: To compete for MAA awards, archers must be MAA members in good standing. (An archer may join MAA at the tournament site before shooting their first round.) Awards will be made on a scratch score basis. State Champions in all MAA Styles, will be awarded Championship pins at the tournament and plaques at the MAA Banquet. Up to three award pins per flight will be awarded according the following unit rule: 1 - 3 archers in a flight, 1st place only; 4 - 6 archers in a flight, 1st and 2nd places; and 7 or more archers in a flight, 1st, 2nd and 3rd places. Flights will be determined after all scores are entered.

10. Teams: Two shooter teams will be recognized - the fee will be \$ 15.00 per team. Both members must belong to the same home club and shoot the same style. Pros and non-pros cannot shoot on the same team. Non-adults (Youth and Cubs) cannot shoot on an adult team. All teams must be registered before the first participant shoots for score. A team plaque will be awarded in each MAA style of shooting; 2nd and 3rd place plaques will be awarded according to the unit rule for individual flights stated above. Plaques will be presented at the MAA Banquet.

Each club may enter one or more club teams, each consisting of: 1-FS, 1-FSL, 1-BHFS, 1-BHFSL, and 1-BB, BH or TRAD. Club teams may include only adult and young adult shooters. A club representative must submit the club team(s) member list by 8:00 AM on Saturday.

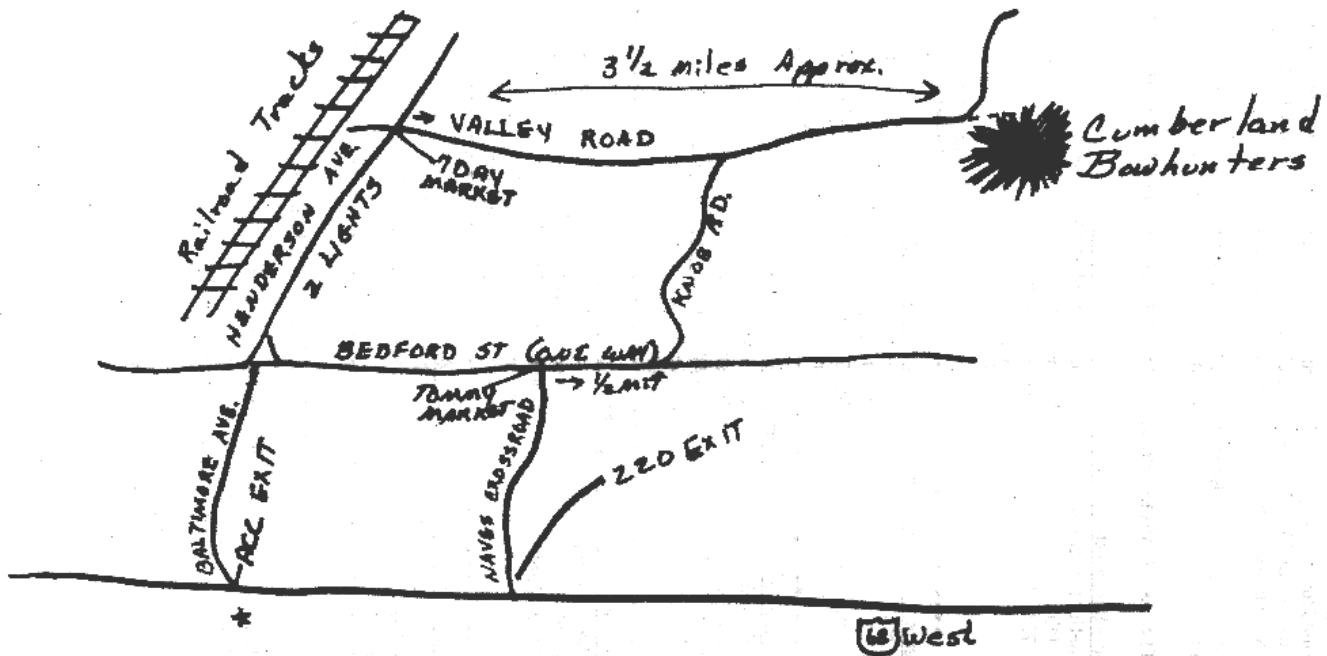
10. General: All MAA/NFAA members are eligible to compete if they are residents of Maryland or Washington, DC, or if a non-resident, are NFAA members through the MAA. Guests are welcome as space is available - guest fees are the same as for MAA/NFAA members – awards by host club. These rules, as well as rules presented at the tournament will be observed by all participants. Members of the Tournament Committee, consisting of the MAA President, Vice President of Awards, NFAA Director, MAA Legal Chairman, Host Club President, and Host Club Tournament Director, will be available at all shooting times to resolve and question requiring a decision.

NFAA/MAA dues may be paid at the tournament prior to shooting, with proof of membership with a Maryland State Chartered club.

No participant shall consume any alcoholic beverage until his or her scorecards are turned in.

Shooters must verify their registration by initialing the verification sheet to verify their style of shooting and division before shooting their first arrow for score. Failure to do so will result in disqualification.

Shooters must turn in their own verified and completely totaled scorecard at the end of each of their shooting times/line.
